Students must have earned their degree within five years of applying (deadline July 15). The Gracie Fund fosters community development by helping recipients connect to Washington County through their commitment to a career and community service. Loan repayment awards of \$5,000 will be awarded to up to three individuals each year. These awards may be renewed for up to three years.</p>
